Apple Has a New Computer

Four Dazzling IIGS Products

A grand new spectrum of color, intricately enriched graphics and a symphony of sound capabilities will make your senses come alive when you use the four premier products developed by Brøderbund specifically for Apple's latest computer breakthrough, the IIGS.

On the IIGS – "GS," for graphics and sound – Apple introduces super-high-resolution graphics (up to 640 x 200), more memory (256K upgradable to over 8 megabytes with add-on cards), a faster (16-bit) processor, a detachable keyboard and mouse, and an internal 64K sound chip that makes your computer sound as good as a radio. Dazzling super-high-resolution designs jump out at you from an RGB monitor displaying a brilliant palette of colors.

Three-and-a-half-inch disk drives make this Apple seem far removed from its Apple II predecessors, yet it is "downward compatible" so the standard five-and-a-quarter-inch drive can be plugged in to run the thousands of titles previously written for the rest of the Apple II family.

Brøderbund has worked closely with Apple to develop these new programs for the IIGS:

- A new, unique version of **The Print Shop™**
- An enhanced **Fantavision™** with super-high-res graphics and synchronized, digitized sound effects.
- **Newsmaker™**, a super-high-res, entry-level personal publishing system.

- **Drawing Table™**, a brand-new tool to let you design and develop highly detailed graphics and drawings.

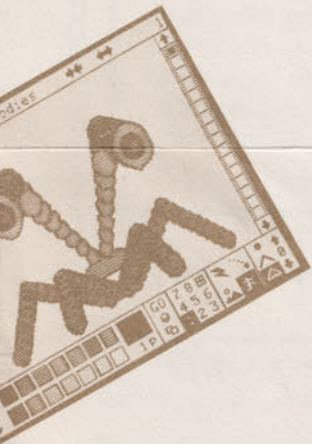
The Print Shop for the IIGS (Coming Soon!)

"The same graphics you've used and loved are now displayed on screen in super-high-res and in color," says Susan Schlagen, Product Manager for the IIGS version of **The Print Shop** – Brøderbund's fabulously popular program that lets you produce custom-designed greeting cards, letterhead, signs and banners. "The whole creative process is very lively on the screen – it's sharper and it's multi-color."

Startling features on the IIGS version include: the ability to create designs with two graphics, full-panel graphics, highly detailed multi-color graphics, vertical banners and upper and lower-case lettering. There are also two features on the IIGS version that are now available on the newly released version of **The Print Shop** for the Apple II: on-screen preview before printing and the ability to save your completed design to disk.

This new version of **The Print Shop** has a brand-new Graphic Editor that adds even more capabilities. Eight colors and patterns are available and even the individual parts of one graphic

When Cooperation Really Counts

We're very proud of our relationship with Apple Computer, which led to our decision to support the IIGS with these new software products. I want to emphasize how very unusual it is for Brøderbund to risk software development on a new machine.

The reason is that as a software publisher, we try to make sure our outside authors develop on a machine that will give them maximum return. Most are living largely on the money they make from each package sold.

Yet we were enticed by the IIGS.

The Apple II has always been our strongest marketplace, and we have a

very strong affiliation with, and a loyalty toward the people who have grown up with the Apple II over the past ten years. Apple itself has also been consistent in providing us with long advance warning of machine changes, to allow us to modify our software.

This level of cooperation gives a company the confidence to work with a hardware manufacturer. I would also like to emphasize that other companies such as Atari have worked closely with us, and as a result we have a lot of enthusiasm for the Atari ST and are developing products for it.

We pushed ahead with development of programs for the IIGS for three

important reasons:

- To show our appreciation to Apple for the close working relationship.
- Because we expect many IIGS owners to come from the ranks of our loyal Brøderbund fans.
- Because we liked what we saw in the machine itself, which needed advanced software to show off its new features.

We are also quite pleased that the IIGS will run most Apple II software, so you don't have to start over with your software library.

Apple was doing its part in upgrading the Apple II series, and we felt it was only fair for us to do our part.



Earth Shaking News

Science Toolkit™ Module 2: Earthquake Lab, the latest product in the Science Toolkit series, is designed to help home scientists learn more about the world's ups and downs.

Everything that seems stable is in fact moving, shifting and absorbing energy. With the **Earthquake Lab**, you'll come to understand the nature of the Earth.

Designed to work with the **Science Toolkit Master Module**, **Earthquake Lab** includes an easy-to-assemble seismoscope that utilizes the photocell from the **Master Module**.

"It's a very sensitive and accurate instrument," says Michael Shorrock, Product Manager. "You'll be able to detect movement you wouldn't otherwise be aware of."

You can pick up vibrations from the vacuum cleaner, from buses and trucks passing by outside, or from someone walking past your bedroom door. Or – on a more serious note – you can learn how to determine the epicenter of an earthquake, find out how various geological foundations absorb shock, and discover how well your house could withstand a major quake.

With the on-screen seismograph software included in **Earthquake Lab**, data is recorded on a strip chart for periods of five minutes to 12 hours. A "trigger" can be set to trip the seismograph and record vibrations while you're away or asleep. And **Earthquake Lab's** Experiment Plotter allows you to print out your strip charts – a handy feature to use with the **Master Module** strip-chart experiments tool.

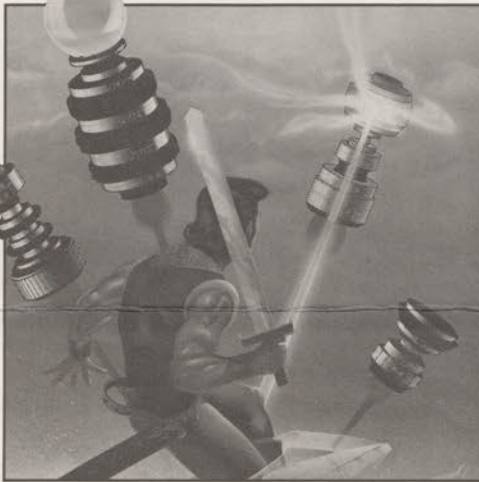

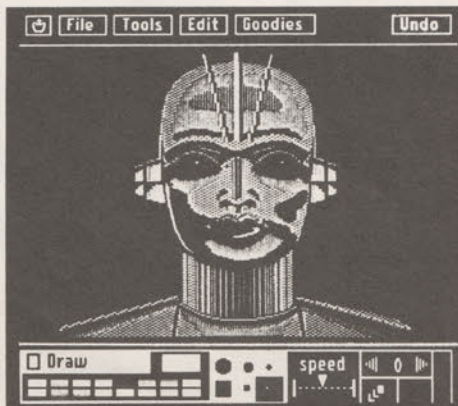

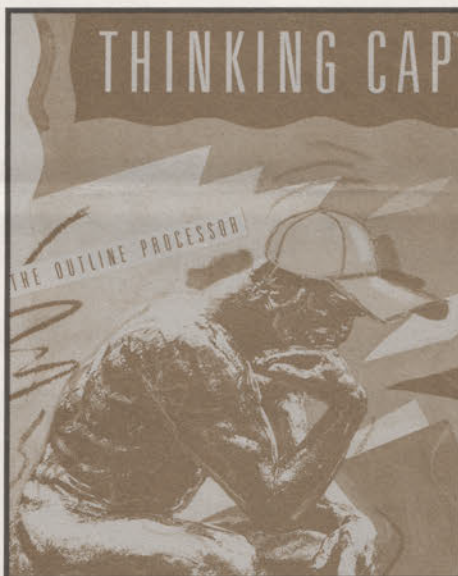

Technical Help As Near As Your Phone

"Ah, hello? Brøderbund? . . ."
 (Caller clears his throat.)
 "I have a little problem . . . I think it's compatibility . . ."

And so it goes. All day long.
 "My dog ate **The Print Shop** for lunch."

"**My Bank Street Writer™** worked fine last night and now, with five minutes to go before my report's due, it won't print. You gotta help me. QUICK!"

They've heard it all in Brøderbund's Customer Services Department, comprising Technical Support and Software-Direct. Never batting an eyelash, they often come to the rescue with a savvy solution on the spot.

And yes, they'll even solve problems with compatibility – between computers and printers, that is.

Customer Services Director Brian Eheler oversees the two groups in this small office building located up the street from Brøderbund's headquarters in San Rafael, Calif. Technical Support, which is headed by Supervisor Dave Ross, troubleshoots software problems and printer compatibility questions, and gives hints – or even a rare answer – for games. Under the guidance of Supervisor Maggie Felkel, Software-Direct, the other arm of Customer Services, handles requests for replacing damaged software, updating existing programs and helping customers find Brøderbund software that is not readily available locally.

"It's a good feeling to be able to help people out," says Felkel, expressing the sentiments of the entire department.

"There's a common feeling here that we know something and want to share it," Ross adds. "In this office, we all have a love for computers."

This is a department that takes the word *service* in Customer Services to heart.

Armed with user's manuals, information provided by hardware manufacturers and the experience gained from daily use of various software, the people on the phone in Technical Support can answer almost any question instantly.

"And if we can't solve a problem immediately," Ross explains, "we'll take a number and call back after we've talked to the programmers or the hardware manufacturer."

In the case of the panicky **Bank**

Street Writer user, according to Ross, after quite some time on the phone and still no action, a Technical Support representative suggested that the caller check to see if the printer cable was hooked up in back. Sure enough, the program started printing just fine after that – even though the caller was a bit embarrassed.

"For some people, they feel more confident if we walk them step by step through a procedure," Ross says, adding that his staff will happily oblige if they're not too busy. "But actually, most of our programs are so easy that many calls turn out to be hardware incompatibility difficulties."

Employees at the phones keep statistics on these types of problems from callers, then report them to Brøderbund's Product Development Department to see if an update can be made.

That's where Felkel comes in. When an update is made available and you want to update your current disk(s), Software-Direct will fulfill your requests. Depending upon the nature of the



update, a fee may be required. Twenty dollars is the standard price for any enhancements made to a program.

"We fulfill all the update requests, and we're pretty prompt about it," she says, pointing out that the process is quickest if users remember to note the name of the product, the type of computer, type of printer and even the name of the disk drive when writing in to request an update.

Felkel's group also helps the various customers with ravenous disk-eating dogs, like the one that lunched on **The Print Shop**.

"Believe me, we've heard almost every story imaginable about how disks get damaged," the supervisor explains.

Software-Direct is also responsible for fulfilling requests for catalogs and helping customers search for releases that don't seem to be on the local store shelves.

"We'll try to help them find a dealer who's supposed to carry the product, or if they like, we'll send it out from here," Felkel says. "We always suggest they shop around first, however, because we can't offer the discounts that many stores can."

This kind of honest emphasis on service has always been a part of Brøderbund's tradition, and it helps build that "family spirit" that both Brøderbund and its customers cherish.

in your design can be colored differently: a red rose with a green stem in a yellow vase, all with the click of a mouse.

The Graphic Editor lets you superimpose text on graphics and has 16 tools, including a tool called "stretch" that lets you size your graphics and text for dramatic effects.

"You can bring in graphics from any of the **Graphics Library** disks and jazz them up with both detail and color," Schlangen adds. As with the other **The Print Shop** versions, there is a full range of borders and fonts that you can print out in a variety of colors including a special "rainbow" effect.

This new version will be available soon. At \$69.95, it's a must-buy for your new IIGs.

Fantavision for the IIGs

(Coming Soon!)

Fantavision leapfrogs from its original resolution to super-high-res and does it with 56 colors to produce eye-popping motion and graphics on screen that can be choreographed to a library of digitized sound effects (a sound library is included).

"The IIGs version fully integrates the major improvements of the new machine: super-high-res graphics, realistic sound and speed," says Product Manager Greg Wrenn. As always, you can use **Fantavision's** "tweening"

powers to fill in the movements of your characters without having to draw each frame as a cartoonist does to create motion. The software does the work for you, in the blink of an eye.

"I like to think **Fantavision** is mostly magic, anyway," Wrenn adds. "You can really make movies now — complete with sound."

Unique to this version is the ability to freeze-frame your designs at the click of a mouse and print them out for others to enjoy.

Suggested retail price is \$59.95 for the IIGs **Fantavision**, which will be available soon.

A brand-new drawing program has been created for the IIGs. Aptly named, **Drawing Table** is an object-oriented drawing program that helps users design graphics in precise detail — and incredible color composition.

Use **Drawing Table** for flow charts, presentation graphics, maps, architectural plans, mechanical diagrams, or anything else you can think of when you need to draw perfect shapes. And with the help of built-in rulers, anything can be drawn to exact scale.

Drawing Table for the IIGs will be released in early 1987.

How can I get Apple Print Shop Companion to print calendars in color?

On side B of the new Apple color version of **The Print Shop** is a program designed to update your **Companion** disk for color printing. To access this program simply insert side B of **The Print Shop** into your disk drive, then turn on your computer. Once the program has loaded, follow the on-screen prompts to update your **Print Shop Companion** disk.

Does The Print Shop support the Epson LQ or Toshiba series of printers?

No, **The Print Shop** is only compatible with printers that have a dot resolution of 120 x 72. Since the Epson LQ series and the Toshiba series have a dot resolution of 180 x 180, it is not possible to get **The Print Shop** to

support those printers without a major rewrite of the program.

Why am I having a problem printing The Toy Shop™ (Apple version) toys with an Epson or Epson-clone printer and the Epson APL (8131) interface?

In order to achieve the optimal printing resolution that **The Toy Shop** is capable of, your printer and interface must be set up to send and receive 8 bits. Many older versions of the Epson APL (8131) interface card were capable of sending only 7 bits. There is a modification available through authorized service centers that will update your card for 8-bit capability.

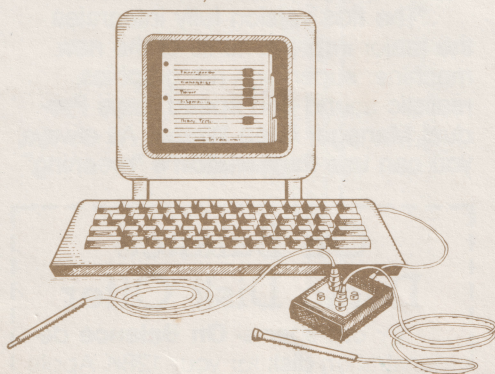
