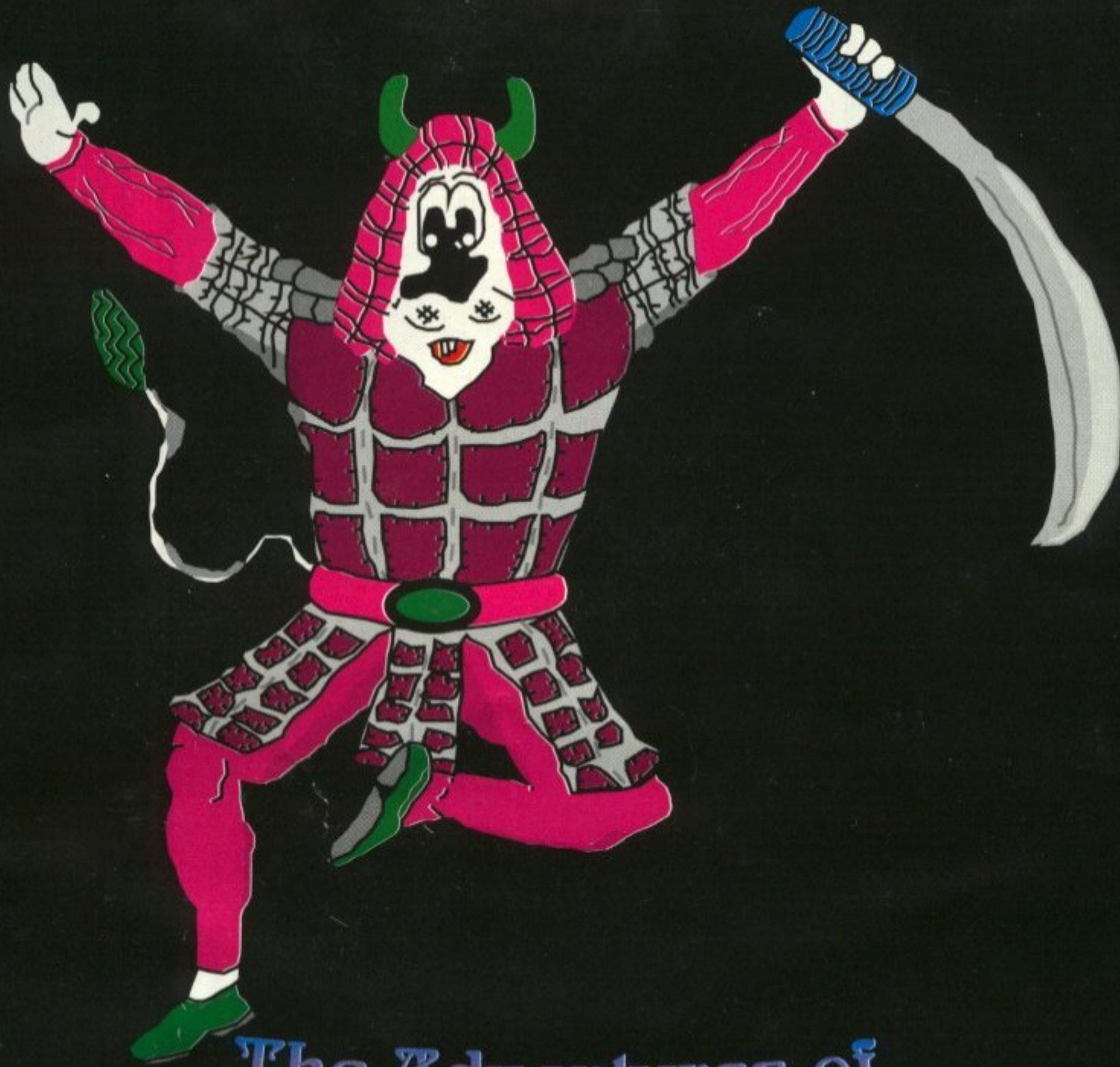

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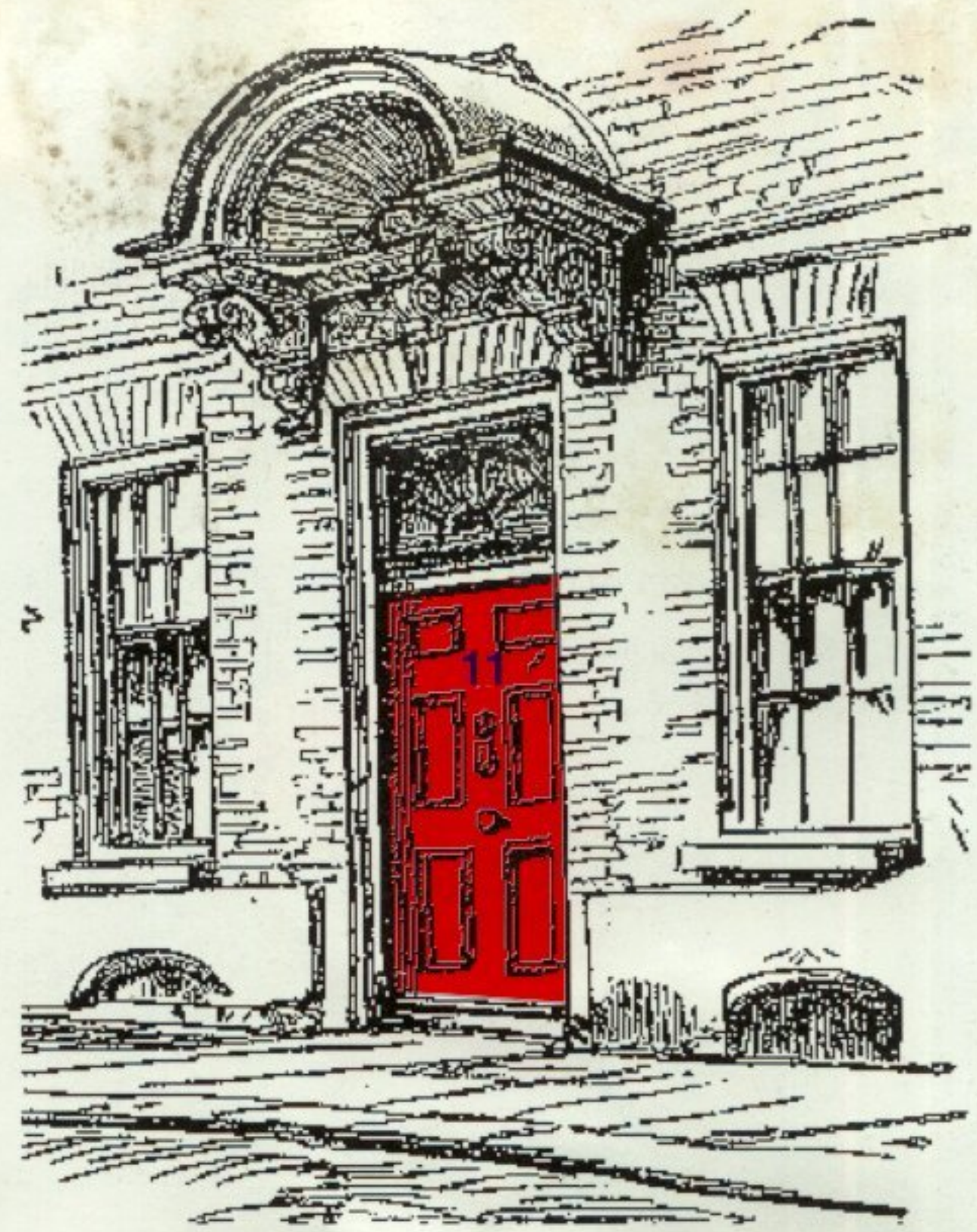

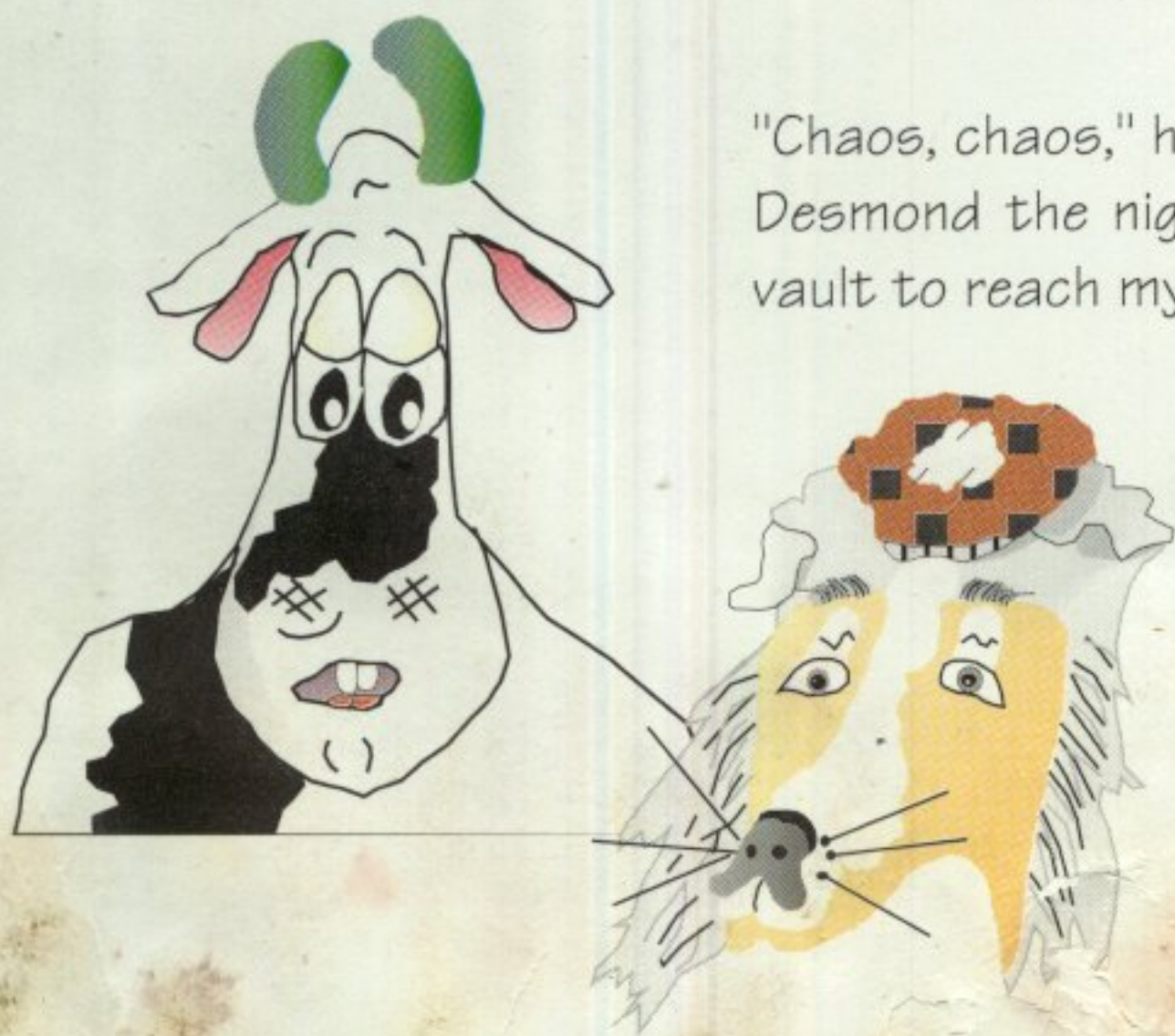

Modern games, such as pool or snooker, require different kinds of tables with varying numbers of pockets and balls. Different sources believe that this game may have been invented in antiquity - at least, Anacharsis, a Scythian prince (about 400 B.C.) regarded as one of the Seven Wise Men of the ancient world, claimed he saw the game billiards played during his travels through Greece. Other experts believe the game is related to an early version of shuffleboard popular during Henry VIII's time, but the actual word billiard is derived from the French

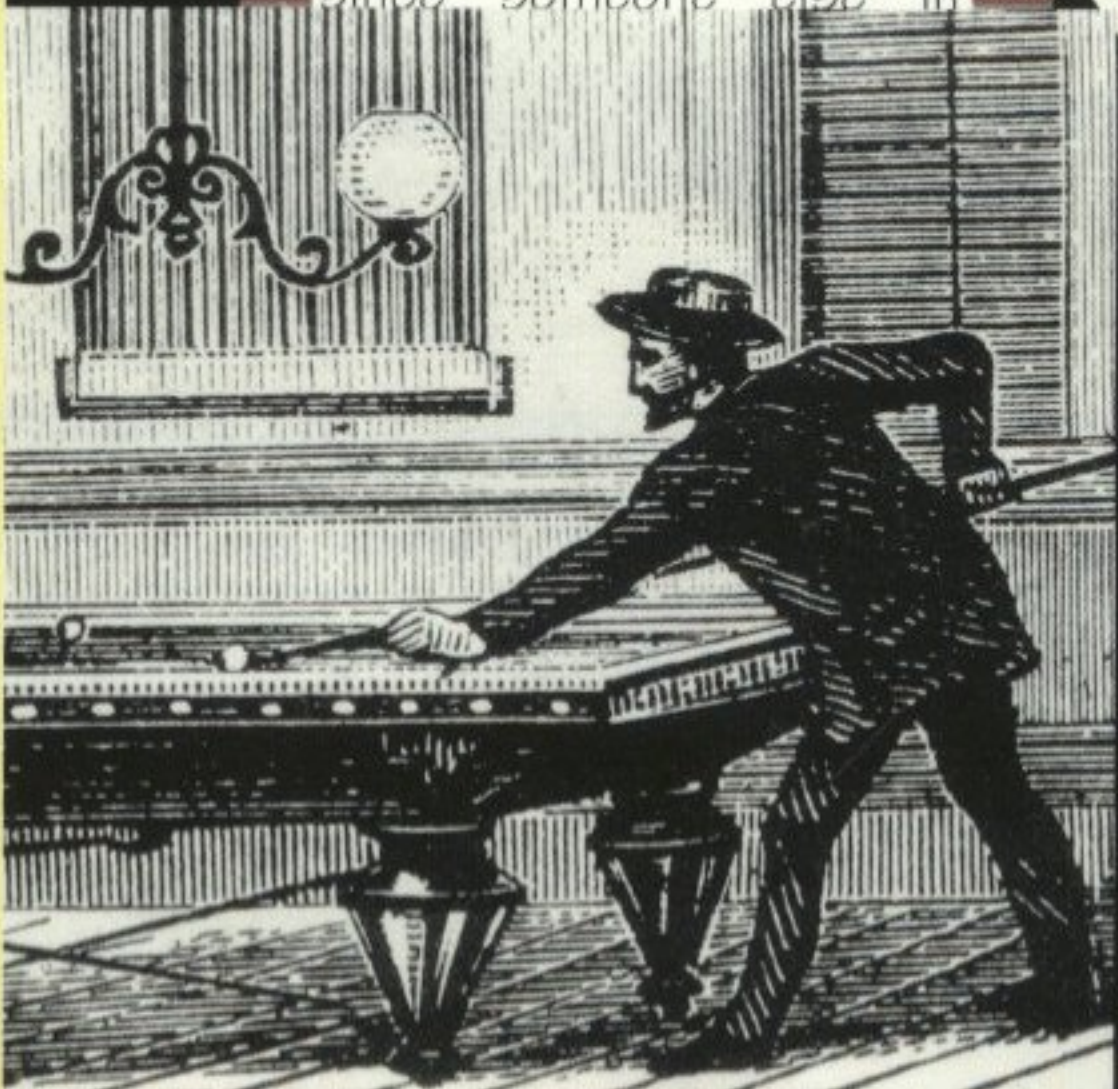
